- 5 _____ 4. Percent project completion based on April 1 enrollment. Not necessary to exhibit at the fair to be considered complete. 5 points - 85% and up; 3 points - 85-74%; 1 point - 74-65%.

- 15 _____ 6. New members by April 1 - 2 points each, 15 points maximum.
