

**Premier 4-H Member Award
Due: Third Friday in January**

What is the Premier 4-H Member Award? This award recognizes 4-H members, age 8 and in third grade to age 18, for excellence in all 4-H clover areas: Head, Heart, Hands, and Health. Points are earned in each area for participation at the club level and beyond for the current 4-H year (January 1, current year to December 31, current year).

What are the levels of recognition? Members may achieve Gold, Silver, or Bronze based on the number of points achieved. Recognition will be held during the Spring Kick Off and Recognition event in March.

To Be Eligible to receive the Gold, Silver or Bronze Premier 4-H Member Award: Complete the Premier 4-H Member Award form and submit to the Extension Office by the deadline. 4-H club member and their advisor must sign the completed form. Advisor's signature verifies that the 4-H member has participated in the activities indicated.
