News You Can Use - 4-H:

- 1. *Darke County 4-H Camp*: Darke County 4-H Camp will be held June 9-13, 2024, at Indian Hills 4-H camp. Please save the date and know spots are limited. More information to follow. If youth are still interested in becoming counselors, have them contact Mercedes immediately.
- 2. *Enrollment:* 4-H Enrollments began November 1! They are due prior to April 1. Please get these in ASAP. Remember advisors must also complete this process! Volunteers that have completed a background check should complete this as soon as possible. This will allow OSU-HR to connect your results to your 4-HOnline account. New Volunteer applications must be submitted by February 1. Please enroll at: 4honline.com
- 3. *Ohio 4-H Conference* is the largest gathering of 4-H volunteers and teens in the country. It will be held Saturday, March 9 in Columbus at the Convention Center. Leadership Camp: June 1-5, 2024 "The Ohio 4-H State Leadership Camp is the premiere leadership development opportunity available to Ohio 4-H members. The focus of the five-day leadership experience is the development of concrete peer leadership skills that will enable participants to have an immediate impact in their home 4-H club, county, community, or school. Sea Camp: **July 19-23, 2024** "The mission of Ohio 4-H Sea Camp is to offer teenage youth an introduction to the Great Lakes through hands-on experiences in a variety of aquatic-based programs. Sea Camp will enable participants to experience Lake Erie-based activities and culture such as aquatic science, water recreation, and fishing. The program is a supervised, educational environment fostered by Ohio 4-H and The Ohio State University."
