Dear Friend in 4-H,

Here's what's happening:

1. **New 4-H Volunteer Applications:** Available from our office or via the web <https://darke.osu.edu/program-areas/4-h-youth-development/2018-4-h-volunteer-application>  
Applications must be submitted by 4:30pm, March 1, 2018.
2. **4-H Camp Counselor Applications:** Available from our office or on the web site <https://darke.osu.edu/program-areas/4-h-youth-development/2018-darke-county-4-h-camp-counselor-application> See the application for details. Completed applications are due to the office by 4:30pm on Friday, November 17. 4-H Camp will be held at Indian Hills, June 18-21, 2018.
3. **County Medal Forms:** Available from our office or on the web site: <https://darke.osu.edu/program-areas/4-h-youth-development/darke-county-4-h-county-medal-application> All 4-H members enrolled in projects are invited to apply in order to be recognized for outstanding project work. Recipients will be recognized during our Spring Kick-Off in March. Completed forms are due to the Extension Office by 4:30pm on Friday, January 19, 2018.
4. **Volunteer Fingerprint Screening:** Letters have gone out to those 4-H volunteers who are scheduled to be rescreened (fingerprinted) in 2018. If you receive this letter, you have until December 31, 2017 to complete your screening. Failure to complete your fingerprinting by that date will result in the rescinding of your volunteer status for 2018. Follow the directions in the letter. To be reimbursed, bring the reimbursement form, along with your receipt to our office.
5. **Hands Across the Darke:** They are working on a community service activity involving active military and need your help. If you or someone in your club has a family member (especially a former 4-H member) currently on active duty, please send me their name and address. Hands would like to send military care packages during the upcoming holiday season.

6. **CARTEENS help needed:** All 4-H youth who currently have either a permit or driver's license are encouraged to apply to help with the CARTEENS program. CARTEENS is held the second Saturday of each month and is for first-time juvenile traffic offenders. Older youth are needed to help with the program, such as reading informational documents and helping with activities. 7. **Carving New Ideas:** November 3-5, 2017, 4-H Camp Ohio. Open to 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade 4-H members, a camping opportunity for older youth, concentrating on the principles of critical thinking and program facilitation. 8. **Cattlemen's Camp:** The Ohio Cattlemen's Association and Weaver Leather are joining together to offer Cattlemen's Camp on October 14-15, 2017. Cattlemen's Camp is open to all beef youth. 9. **Darke County United Way:** Did you know? If you donate to the United Way, you may designate the Darke County 4-H Program to be the recipient of your donation. Simply write "Darke County 4-H" on the pledge designation line. Funds from the United Way are used to offset the cost of 4-H camp to our youth. Thank you for your support!
10. **End of the Year Packets:** Packets will be available for pick-up after Thursday, September 7. Packets include membership certificates, pins, volunteer reenrollment forms, 2018 enrollment surveys, leadership and achievement award forms, and more. Please pick these up at your earliest convenience.
11. **New in 2018: The 4-H age-grade policy will change in Calendar Year 2018.**  
THE CURRENT 4-H AGE-GRADE POLICY IS: Ohio 4-H membership is based on a child's age AND grade. Cloverbud eligibility begins when a child is enrolled in kindergarten and is five years old as of January 1 of the current year. Cloverbud participation ends when a child is eligible for competitive events, 4-H projects, and other older youth activities, which is age eight and in the third grade as of January 1 of the current year. Membership requires enrollment in an authorized Ohio 4-H club or group under the direction of an OSU Extension professional or an approved adult volunteer. A youth's 4-H eligibility ends December 31 the year they turn 19. Joining Ohio 4-H is a privilege and responsibility for individuals and is subject to the Ohio 4-H Code of Conduct and applicable policies of The Ohio State University.

**THE NEW 4-H AGE-GRADE POLICY IS:** Ohio 4-H membership is based on a child's age AND grade as of January 1 of the current calendar year. Eligibility for Cloverbud participation begins when a child is age 5 and enrolled in kindergarten. Eligibility for participation in 4-H projects and competitive events begins when a child is age 8 and in third grade. Any youth age 9 or above is eligible for project membership, regardless of grade level. Membership requires enrollment in an authorized Ohio 4-H club or group under the direction of an OSU Extension professional or an approved adult volunteer. A youth's 4-H eligibility ends December 31 the year he or she turns 19. Joining Ohio 4 H is a privilege and responsibility for individuals and is subject to the Ohio 4-H Code of Conduct and applicable policies of The Ohio State University.

Basically the change is that 9 year olds are eligible for project membership. Questions? Don't be afraid to ask.

12. **Ohio 4-H Health Hero Applications** are due October 1, 2017. Any teen in grades 9-12 interested in becoming a state-level 4-H Health Hero is invited to apply. The 4-H Health Heroes program provides youth with the opportunity to represent 4-H and promote healthy living in their communities. Teens who serve as Health Heroes will gain valuable leadership experience, be able to teach a variety of health-related topics to people of all ages, and have a chance to travel to Washington D.C. for the National Youth Summit on Healthy Living (if selected). Applicants will be notified of their acceptance by October 6<sup>th</sup>. A required training will be held on Saturday, October 14, 2017. 13. **Premier Member Award:** Remind your 4-H club members to complete the application to be a Premier 4-H Member. Applications are due January 19, 2018.
